When you get below 30S you will not likely hear Gulf Harbour Radio as you will be in the skip for 8MHz. Listen to the Coastal weather situation and forecasts on Maritime NZ

Frequencies are as follows and chose depending on your distance and the time of day.

Announcements are made on the international calling frequencies; 2182, 4215, and 6215 Then switch to the corresponding working frequencies for the forecast; 2207, 4146 and 6224.

UTC Times are 0133, 0533, 1333 and 1733 and these broadcasts are on the VHF as well.

The broadcast starts with the situation and this is followed with the regional forecasts in this order

Plenty for those arriving in Tauranga

Colville for those arriving in Auckland and Whangarei

Brett for those arriving in Opua
